2010 CLASS INVOLVEMENT

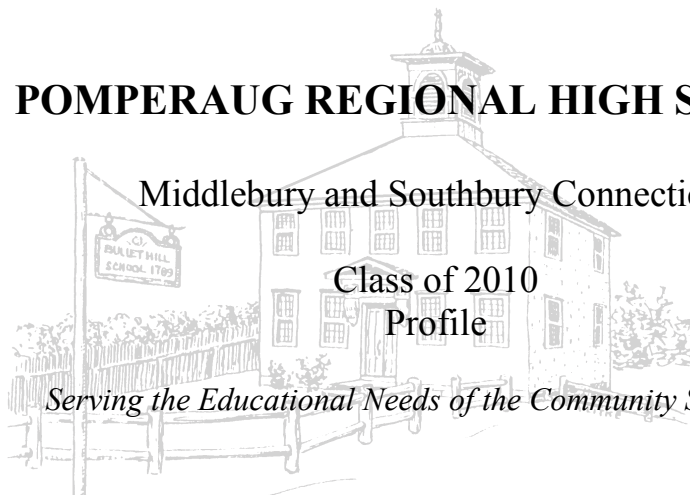
The level of involvement for the Class of 2010 was 89%, including: athletics (74%), music (30%), drama (11%), Student Government (9.7%), and other organizations (58%).

ABILITY GROUPING

Students are placed in one of the three ability levels Honors (H), Academic and Core (C) in each of the following subject areas: English, Social Studies, Math, Science

CLASS STANDING INFORMATION

Both unweighted and weighted GPA's are provided on each student transcript and are completed after the sixth semester.

The weighted G.P.A. is computed by:

- Attaining a 3-year unweighted GPA
- Assessing a level factor to each course i.e., AP = 4, Honors = 3 Academic = 2, Core = 1.
- Calculating the level factor.
- Adding that factor to the unweighted GPA

Example:

1. Unweighted GPA 3.500	2. 6 Academic credits = $6 \times 2 = 12$ 3 Honors credits = $3 \times 3 = 9$ 3 AP credits = $3 \times 4 = 12$ 12	3. $33 \div 12 = 2.750$	4. 2.750 (Avg. level factor) 3.500 (Unweighted GPA) 6.250 (Weighted GPA)
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
